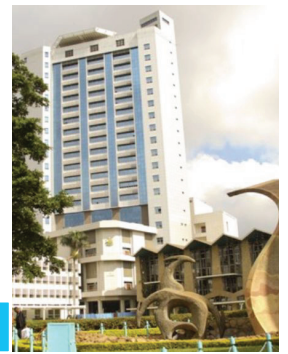

VOTER EDUCATION & SENSITIZATION

Voter Education and Sensitization was done by the Independent Electoral Commissions (IEC). The first voter education and sensitization webinar for the UoN community was held on the evening of March 2nd, 2022. The virtual event that garnered both staff and students was moderated by Prof. Ndeti Ndati, a staff commissioner in the IEC 2022 and comprised presentations from student commissioners' Raphael Wamono, Sharon Aserena, the Director Legal and Corporate Board Services, Mr Collins Omondi and the IEC Chairman Prof. Collins Odote.

Raphael Wamono, a student from the Faculty of Engineering and one of the three IEC Student commissioners, gave a presentation on the Importance of participating in UNSA elections whereas Sharon Aserena also an IEC Student commissioner from the Faculty of Science and Technology, gave a presentation on Disqualification from vying.

Mr. Collins Omondi, Director Legal and Corporate Board Services gave a presentation on the electoral process whereby he sensitized members on PART IV of the UNSA constitution 2017(Amended), 2021.

The 2022 University of Nairobi Students Association (UNSA) council members were sworn in on March 26, 2022, at UoN's Taifa Hall.

During the swearing-in ceremony, the IEC 2022 chair, Prof. Collins Odote gave a summary of the whole electoral process; how the teams started at 136 and ended up at 18. He remarked on the challenges that the commission faced and thanked the management and the student community for the support that they accorded the commission throughout the election timelines.

In her speech after taking the oath of office, the elated Thogo said she was thankful to God for giving them the strength of not to give up. She said the win was a result of stubborn determination, consistency, and raw hard work and thanked the delegates and the broader faculty representatives who listened to their manifesto and voted for her team. She promised to work with the University administration to deliver her team's manifesto to UoN students.

While congratulating the new student leaders, the Dean of Students Mr. Johnson Kinyua, noted that this is the third student of Law that has been an UNSA leader, 'The Faculty of Law has given us the past three UNSA leaders, starting with Anne Mvurya, Eddie Mwendwa and now Melvine Thogo.

The objectives of the workshop were to:

- i) Orient the newly elected UNSA leaders into their roles and responsibilities in student leadership.
- ii) Offer a forum for UNSA Leaders to interact with the University Management.
- iii) Enable student leaders' gain understanding of the University policies and procedures.
- iv) Empower student leaders on strategies for effective student leadership.
- v) Enable UNSA Leaders understand how ethics, morals, and values relate to their leadership dilemmas.
- vi) Enable UNSA learn how to engage in conflict productively and work towards conflict resolution.
- vii) Enable UNSA leaders understand that serving as a leader is more than holding a position.

EVALUATION OF CASCADED PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS

The Academic Affairs Division is the coordinator of Teaching and Learning activities in the University. Therefore the Deputy Vice Chancellor Academic Affairs, Prof. Julius Ogeng'o who is the head of the Division evaluated the Heads of Sections against the targets set out in the beginning of the 2021/2022 Financial Year between 8th March, 2022 and 21st March, 2022.

The cascaded targets were drawn from the University Strategic Plan 2018-2023 on Teaching & Learning Strategic Issue; Academic Affairs Division Annual Work Plan 2021/2022 and the DVC AA Performance Contract 2021/2022. The items were distributed in the function areas of the Division. This ushered in the monitoring and evaluation process to ensure the activities committed are undertaken and monitored biweekly and evaluated quarterly. The Evaluation exercise was conducted to determine the status of accomplishment of tasks identified and action taken to ensure timely completion of assigned tasks. The Sections evaluated were:

Admissions; Examinations; Dean of Students Office; Graduate Student Affairs; Quality Assurance; Senate Secretariat; and Student Records, Data & Statistics.

The DVC AA encouraged the Heads of Sections to remain focused on the activities and ensure the tasks outstanding were undertaken to completion.

During the evaluations sessions the following opportunities for improvements were noted:

- i) Updating and revision of procedures, instructions and flow charts for all Sections
- ii) Preparation and implementation of Monitoring and Evaluation Frameworks to enhance staff performance and uptake of procedures
- iii) Undertake staff performance appraisal and report quarterly
- iv) Prepare and maintain accurate maintenance schedules on Work Environment
- v) Implementation of weekly staff meetings and sensitization on relevant issues
- vi) Open and maintain a standard complaint registers in all Sub Sections and analyze and report bi-weekly
- vii) Undertake all actions outlined in the Service Charter
- viii) Follow up of Procurement Process and maintain accurate records
- ix) Undertake minimum website update requirement in all Sections in the Academic Division website
- x) Undertake identification and implementation of flagship projects
- xi) Maintain accurate and proper records
- xii) Accurately align performance Contract records with the required evidences

LAUNCH OF SMART CLASSROOM

The Smart Classroom was officially launched through a hybrid event at the University of Nairobi, Kenya on Monday, April 25, 2022. This is a collaboration between University of Nairobi, International Centre for Higher Education Innovation under the auspices of UNESCO (UNESCO-ICHEI), UNESCO Priority Africa and External Relations Sector, UNESCO regional office for Eastern Africa in Nairobi, the Kenya Ministry of Education, Science and Technology.

During the ceremony, Prof. LI Ming, Director of UNESCO-ICHEI, reiterated the committed of UNESCO-ICHEI to supporting Kenya on the journey of higher education digital transformation. He also expressed his hope that the IIOE Kenya National Centre will fulfill its mission to bridge UNESCO-ICHEI and Kenya's higher education community.

PS Jerome Ochieng, Ministry of ICT remarked on how the University continues to play the leadership role in the country. He commended the University of Nairobi for embracing digital transformation.

On his part, the UoN Vice Chancellor, Prof. Stephen Kiama noted how important the launch is to the University. He said, 'This is an important day for the University of Nairobi as well for the entire higher education sector and Kenya as a whole, to launch the IIOE Kenya National Center. The journey working together with UNESCO-ICHEI started in 2018 with the visit of the Chancellor to China. We have worked consistently since then and this has resulted in two key initiatives; International Institute of Online Education (IIOE) Kenya National Center and The Smart Classroom.

The International Institute of Online Education (IIOE) was launched by UNESCO-ICHEI together with 11 African and Asian HEIs, 9 Global EdTech enterprises and 4 HEIs in December 2019, with the vision to support the realization of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 4 and the Education 2030 Agenda by empowering the digital transformation of higher education systems. IIOE provides a multilingual online education platform, offering online courses and teacher training programmes in ICT competencies, covering areas such as Big Data, Artificial Intelligence, online and blended pedagogy. With over 30 partner HEIs worldwide, IIOE provides a holistic support ecosystem for the digital transformation of higher education. Partner HEIs engage in joint research, exchange best practices and information through meetings and webinars, joint development and mutual sharing of online curricula, supporting each other along the way to improve higher education quality, equity, inclusion and relevance. Since its launch, IIOE has benefited over 9,000 teachers in 135 countries worldwide.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH AWARENESS DAY

The University of Nairobi, through the University Health Services, held a Health Awareness Day to commemorate the World Health Day on April 7, 2022 at the Chancellor Court Main Campus. The 2022 (WHO) theme was 'Our Planet, Our Health'. The University customized the theme by articulation of relevant health promotion activities under the theme: 'Health Promotion for Well-being'. The occasion brought together healthcare institutions in Nairobi and set up tents to offer various health services to staff and students.

Officially opening the session the DVC AA Prof. Julius Ogeng'o emphasized the importance of good health and encouraged staff and students to take advantage of the presence of the healthcare providers to seek advice on various health issues and tests on various parameters.

The Academic Affairs Division continued to collect and consolidate data on Teaching & Learning activities as a way of enabling better decision making by management based on accurate data on various areas on Teaching and Learning. The first phase of the consolidated was presented in the 233rd Senate meeting held on 14th March, 2022. Further data set was considered important and an addendum of these consolidated data included the following;

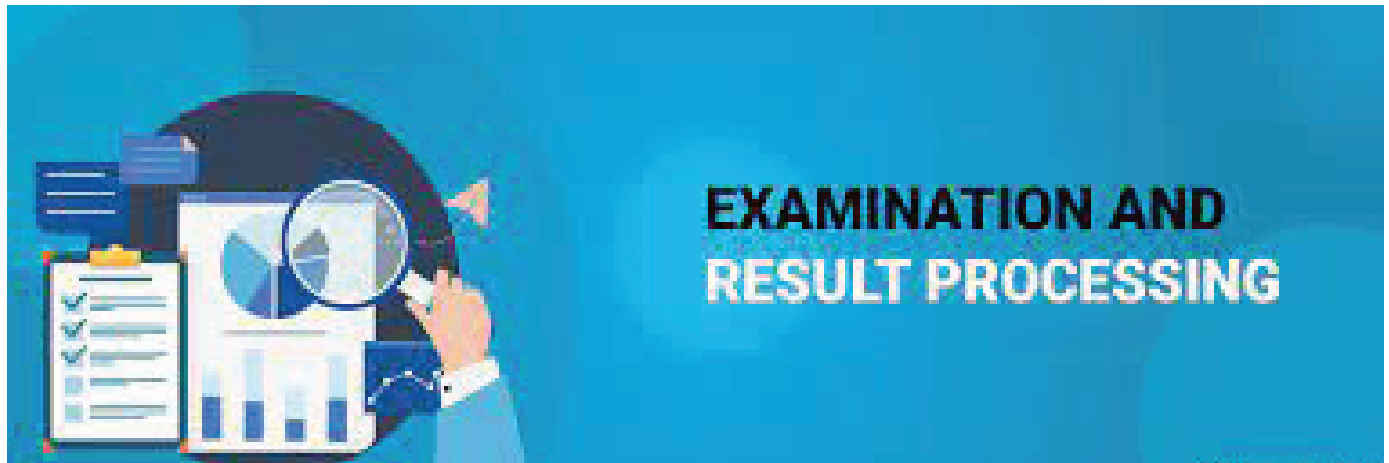

SENSITIZATION OF STAFF ON ACADEMIC PROCESS

The Departments form the basic unit of academic matters in the University. These departments make up a faculty. Therefore the focus of any academic process is implemented at Department and Faculty level. This formed the basis of the regular sensitization of staff in the Departments on various academic process. The DVC AA Prof. Julius Ogeng'o held a sensitization session for the Faculty of Health Sciences on 4th April, 2022 and Faculty of Science & Technology on 5th April, 2022; for Examination process, Curriculum Review process and Staff Course load data. This sessions enabled clear understanding of the process and availability of data on Course and Staff workload distribution in the Faculty.



4TH INTERNATIONAL WHEELCHAIR DAY

The University hosted the event at the Graduation square jointly with the Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya on March 1, 2022. The theme for the 2022 Celebrations was "My Wheelchair, My right to Inclusion". Key activities that marked the celebrations include a procession to the Central Business District, Speeches from the Vice Chancellor, and Board Chair of the National Council for Persons with Disabilities, representative of the Principal Secretary, Ministry of Transport, Infrastructure, Housing, Urban Development and Public Works and the Principal Secretary for the Ministry of Sports, Culture and Heritage. Globally, the International Wheelchair Day is marked on 1st March annually, the day was first launched in 2008 by Steve Wilkinson who is a wheelchair user. The day is commemorated to celebrate the positive impact of a wheelchair in the lives of the users, celebrate people who make the World a better and more accessible place for people with mobility disabilities and acknowledge and react constructively to people who need a wheelchair, but are unable to acquire one.

Five beneficiaries were awarded wheelchairs to aid their mobility. The Ministry of Transport urged Persons with Disabilities to share their input in various transport policies whereas the PS, Heritage urged the University to take up more research in disability to inform policy direction and programming. The Vice Chancellor reiterated the commitment of the University in taking a leadership role in disability inclusion and continuous improvement in processes and programs to be more disability inclusive as well as fostering collaborations with strategic partners in disability inclusion towards World Class University committed to Scholarly Excellence.

LIGHT ACADEMY VISITS UON

The University of Nairobi welcomed students from Light Academy Mombasa. The Students visited the University and were taken through Career choice, Career Paths, Programmes available at the University of Nairobi, subjects and cluster point for UoN flagship programmes and extra-curricular activities available at UoN. The students had a chance to experience first-hand the warmth of staff at the University, the impeccable facilities and state of the art learning equipment at the University.
