

STUDENT CENTRED FINANCING MODEL

(New Higher Education Funding Model)

Government Scholarships for University Students







Introduction

The Student Centred Financing Model (New Higher Education Funding Model) was unveiled by President Willam Ruto on May 3, 2023 to address challenges faced by public universities and Technical and Vocational Education (TVET) institutions as a result of massive enrolment and inadequate funding.

The new funding model replaced the Differentiated Unit Cost (DUC) that was used to finance universities. The model delinks placement from funding and puts emphasis on a student's financial need.

With the new model, universities and TVET institutions will no longer receive block funding in the form of capitation. Instead, funding to students will be through scholarships, loans and household contributions.

Government Scholarships

The Universities Fund will provide scholarships to students between 30% to 70% depending on level of need. The deficit will be met through household contributions and loans. To receive scholarships, students will be required to formally apply on the Higher Education Funding (HEF) Portal – www.hef.co.ke. The Means Testing Instrument (MTI) tool will be used to determine the level of need for funding students.

Key Players

The Student Centred Financing Model is being implemented jointly by Universities Fund (UF), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Kenya Universities, Colleges Central Placement Service (KUCCPS) and State Department for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (SD-TVET). On its part, UF will award scholarships to students, HELB will provide loans to students while KUCCPS will be in charge of placing KCSE graduates to higher learning institutions. Other players are higher learning institutions. the recipients of loans and scholarships awarded to students inform of fees, while parents will provide household contributions towards educating their children.

Benefits of the Student Centred Financing Model

- Ensures that all eligible Kenyan students are provided with adequate financial support towards their education.
- Promotes provision and access to quality higher education.
- Ensures all students are equitably and adequately supported based on their level of financial need.
- Ensures timely disbursement of funds to students through their higher learning institutions.

Types of Government Funding

Under the Student Centred Financing Model, students will benefit from scholarships and loans to finance their tertiary education.

Eligibility

Only candidates who sat their KCSE examination in 2022 onwards are eligible for scholarships under the Student Centred Financing Model.
